

Editorial Policy and Publication Guidelines

1. Introduction

The following editorial guidelines for the publication of *Revista de investigación en Política Exterior Argentina (Argentine Foreign Policy Research Journal)* state the general standards for writing opinion pieces, academic articles, and bibliographical reviews.

Unpublished opinion pieces and research articles will be considered for publication, as well as bibliographical reviews on the following thematic axes: international politics; international political economy; international cooperation; international organizations, international security, regional integration, defense and foreign policy, geopolitics, Latin America's development, paradigms and theoretical approaches to International Relations and Foreign Policy. Articles on other thematic axes that show they contribute to the field of international relations and its relationship with Argentine foreign policy will also be evaluated.

All the topics will try to contribute, directly or indirectly, to the theoretical, methodological, and applied development of Argentine foreign policy.

2. Regarding double-blind refereed peer evaluation review

All articles received will first be reviewed by the journal's editorial committee to assess formal and normative aspects of writing. Then they will be sent to two external evaluators, who will decide if they are publishable, if they need corrections in order to be publishable, or if they should be rejected. In case of difference of opinion, they will be sent to a third evaluator, who will define its condition of publication. The opinions of the evaluators will be final and unappealable.

The evaluation process has an estimated minimum duration of one month and a maximum of three months. After this stage, the publisher will communicate the author their decision.

3. Copyright

Sending a paper to *Revista de investigación en Política Exterior Argentina* will imply the automatic transfer of copyright ownership so that it can be edited, reproduced and/or publicly transmitted by any medium.

4. Submission

The works must be sent in digital format to the following email: revistapea@gmail.com

5. Language

The papers submitted by the authors must be written in Spanish, English, French, or Portuguese.

6. Extension of articles

- Opinion piece: between 8 and 10 pages
- Academic article: between 15 and 20 pages
- Bibliographic review: between 2 and 3 pages

7. First Page/Cover

All articles sent must have a title page where the title author's full name; highest academic degree achieved; institutional affiliation, and email address will appear (in Spanish, English, French or Portuguese);.

8. Article Summary

Opinion pieces and academic articles must be accompanied by an abstract in Spanish, French or Portuguese, and another one in English of up to 200 words each, along with five keywords in both selected languages. Articles in English will also present the abstract and keywords in Spanish.

9. Page Layout

- Paper size: A4.
- Upper and lower margins: 2.5 centimeters.
- Left and right margins: 3 centimeters.
- Main Body Font: Times New Roman, size 12.
- Footnotes Font Times New Roman, size 11.
- Title Font: Times New Roman, size 14
- Indentation: first line of each paragraph, 1 centimeter.
- Alignment: Justified
- Line spacing: 1.5
- Consecutive numbering of all pages including the bibliography.

10. Tables and Graphics

Tables and graphics should be sent in a separate file from the text. They can also be pasted into the text as an object (not as an image), and its source and retrieval link must be indicated.

11. Citations

All citations will be prepared under the guidelines established by *The American Psychological Association* (APA): author (date):

Examples:

(Russell, 1984)

(Russell, 1984, p. 171)

(Russell, 1984, pp. 171-172)

Direct or verbatim quotes

All quotations comprising 40 words or fewer must be added in the same paragraph, enclosed in double quotation marks.

Quotes that exceed 40 words must be displayed in a separate paragraph, in a block, with a 6-point indentation to the left and to the right. No quotation marks or line spacing will be used. In this case, the font size will be 11.

Missing words or phrases will be replaced by ellipsis enclosed by parentheses.

Information on Quoted Authors

In the case of one work with **two authors**, their surnames must be separated by “y” (for texts in Spanish), “&” (for articles in English), “e” (for articles in Portuguese), and “et” (for articles in French).

Example: Autonomy was perceived at the same time as a condition that was not typical of Latin American countries and, consequently, as a goal to be achieved (Russel & Tokatlián, 2001, p. 78).

In the case of one work with **three to five authors**, all surnames will be used in the first citation and, for subsequent ones, only the first will be used together with the phrase *et al.*

Example: Actis Busso, Calderón and Zelicovich (2017) claim that...According to Actis et al. (2017).

In the case of one work with **six or more authors**, only the first name will be used, followed by *et al.*, as from its first use.

In the case of **institutional** or **corporate authors**, the name of the group will be cited for the first use and then you can use the abbreviation. Example: “Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC, 2020)” and then ECLAC (2020).

When **two or more works** are quoted, they will be ordered alphabetically following the order of the list of references.

Example: Many researchers have studied... (Fabbrini, 2009; Leiras, 2008; Mainwaring and Shugart, 2002; and Neustadt, 1993).

When **two or more works by the same author** are quoted, they should be ordered by the year of publication.

When **secondary sources or a citation within a citation are used**, they should be indicated by "cited in ..."

Example: Stanley Hoffman (cited in Perrota, 2013).

The secondary source must be referenced in the bibliography

If the **source used does not have a date**, "n.d." is used. Example: "Bologna (n.d.)"

When including **citations by the same author with the same date of publication**, a subscript is added to the year of publication: "(Zelicovich, 2020a), (Zelicovich, 2020b)"; and all are alphabetically ordered by title in the bibliography.

Journalistic articles:

- When the journalistic article has an author, it will be cited in the same way as a work with an author, and, in the same way, referenced in the bibliography.

- When the article has a title but no author, it will be cited at the bottom of the page.

- When the article has neither author nor title, it will be cited in the body of the text and, only once, the newspaper name and the years consulted in the bibliography. For example: "(*La Nación*, octubre 13, 2013, p. 5)". And in the bibliographic references: "*La Nación*. Diario, Buenos Aires (2013-2016)".

Paraphrased quotes

The non-verbatim paraphrased quotation is one that reflects or summarizes the idea of a cited author without using quotation marks or without placing it in a separate paragraph when it exceeds the length indicated in verbatim quotations. In this case, the year and the page number will be indicated.

The page number can only be deliberately omitted when the paraphrase summarizes several ideas expressed throughout an entire work and not a particular idea easily located in the mentioned source.

12. In relation to bibliography

Coincidentally with the citations, the bibliographic references will be prepared under the guidelines of *The American Psychological Association* (APA):

Cited sources will be arranged alphabetically in ascending order (from A to Z).

In case of citing two or more works by the same author, these will be ordered according to the date of publication, starting with the oldest.

When the cited source is a digital one, the website where it is available or the DOI must be indicated.
